2025年11月28日，本校邀請印度文化大使 Sunny Singh 蒞校，帶來一場以「寶萊塢鏡頭下的印度風情：傳統與流行的交鋒」為主題的國際講座。活動吸引了來自不同背景的學生、教職員與社區人士熱烈參與。Sunny Singh 先生與其團隊抵達後，由本校劉遠楨副校長、學務處蔡葉榮學務長、國際事務處謝宜君處長與進修推廣處董澤平處長帶領行政團隊熱情迎接。為慶祝建校 130 週年，大家在活動開始前，於大門口旁由著名女高音、本校名譽博士校友簡文秀捐贈的聖誕樹前合影留念。

作為演員與藝術家，Sunny Singh 先生在演講中分享了許多精彩內容。他以印度概況為開場，介紹其人口、語言、民族、歷史、宗教與文化傳統；接著談到寶萊塢電影如何反映這些印度社會的面貌，並呈現傳統價值與流行文化之間的平衡。演講中最引人入勝的橋段之一，是 Sunny Singh 先生帶領觀眾一起體驗寶萊塢舞蹈，讓大家親身感受寶萊塢的活力與魅力。

On November 28, National Taipei University of Education (NTUE) hosted Sunny Singh, India's Cultural Ambassador, for a special talk titled "Cultural India Through Bollywood's Eyes: Tradition vs. Popularity."
